Gatineau, June 21, 2011—The Language Technologies Research Centre (LTRC) is working in collaboration with Université du Québec en Outaouais professor Marie-Josée Goulet in a new project to create an assessment model for its new interactive language technology tool.

The LTRC's new online language tool is set to be made available to Canadian students in translation programs in the fall of 2011.

The Tool Assessment Model project, led by Professor Goulet, is meant to create a comprehensive method to evaluate this new language technologies portal to examine the strengths and weaknesses it presents, and to make further improvements to benefit its future users.

This project consists of several procedures that will analyze the effectiveness and efficiency of the portal's three modules, find underlying problems and develop ways for users to have their say about their likes and dislikes concerning the tool.

The LTRC is pleased to be working with Professor Marie-Josée Goulet on the Tool Assessment project to improve its language technology toolbox and portal, and prepare users to get the most out of this innovation in language technologies.

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
